Small group intensive instruction is possible because of our four title paras and our math and reading interventionists. Our title team is able to provide support for a high number of students in Kindergarten through fifth grade. We will work on restructuring to meet the continued need of students with the change of our math interventionist going from 1.0 interventionist to 0.5 interventionist.
